Educate Together briefing document on the costs of establishing new schools in Ireland

400 new schools by 2030

The Programme for Government commits the Department of Education and Skills and the Minister of Education to:

"Strengthen parental choice and diversity in our school system, reflecting the need in modern Ireland for new forms of multidenominational and non- denominational education.... We will increase the number of non-denominational and multi-denominational schools with a view to reaching 400 by 2030."

This ambitious commitment needs to be followed up with targeted funding to the voluntary school patrons that establish these schools.

Facts about funding for new schools

- Current Government funding doesn't come close to covering the real financial costs incurred by voluntary school patrons.
- There is no grant for opening new second-level schools at present.

Educate Together's fully costed plan for educational equality

- Right now, Educate Together offers a **fully costed, practical, achievable plan** to embed equality in the education system: the establishment of a national network of equality-based primary and second-level schools.
- Educate Together has opened ten times as many new schools as any other single patron in the past ten years.
- Educate Together schools are **equality-based schools** schools that don't demand proof of religion at the front gate; schools that don't segregate children along religious lines during the school day; schools that **cherish all children equally**.
- There are now an estimated **15,000 20,000 student's names signed up to campaign lists all over Ireland**. These are names signed up for both primary and second-level Educate Together school places. **That number grows every day**.



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What can be done to ensure that the opening of new schools is properly funded in Ireland?

1) New School Grants

The schedule of grants for opening new schools must be reformed as a matter of urgency, so that any new grants:

- meet the full costs incurred by management bodies in opening schools;
- are paid directly to management bodies;
- are paid as soon as schools are sanctioned;
- are financed from **outside the capitation budget**. This work is one-off, capital-type expenditure, and should not reduce in any way the monies available to schools, which are already underfunded.

2) Core Grants for Management Bodies

There is an urgent need to **review Educate Together's core grant**. This grant is now lower - at €133,000 - than it was in 2007, when Educate Together represented just 40 schools, in comparison to the 90 we now represent.

We hope that you will support proposals for a new, realistic scheme of funding for this vital work, as this is imperative if real progress is to made towards providing school choice for parents and communities in Ireland.
